A Reminder from



While the weather is (finally) getting warmer, this does not mean your water lines are no longer in danger of freezing. Due to our abnormally frigid winter, the ground's frost level is deeper than usual winters. To avoid a frozen water line this late in the game, if your H2O does not maintain a steady temp above 40 degrees, make sure to open your water lines to a slow stream when not in use.



Spring City Reminders

The snow is melting, the weather is warming up, and for some of you, your furry family members are anxious to get outside. Please keep in mind the following ordinances in regards to your pets.

3-1-5 Animals:

3. *Animals running at large. At large means an animal found off the premises of the owner or upon the public streets, alleys, public grounds or parks within the City. A dog or cat shall not be deemed at large:*

a. *If it is attached to a leash...*

b. *It is accompanied by or at the side of the owner...and obedient to commands of the owner or competent person.*

4. *Nuisance...An animal shall be considered a nuisance if it:*

a. *Damages, soils, defiles or defecates on private property other than the owner's or on public walks and recreation areas unless such waste is immediately removed and properly disposed of by the owner.*
