Parking – The Can’s & Cannot’s

Compared to other parts of the country, our snowy winter here in Northern Iowa has been kept to a minimum. However, when the weather does turn inclement, it’s important to remember our Snow Emergency ordinance.

3-3-30 PARKING DURING SNOW EMERGENCY
No person shall park, abandon, or leave unattended any vehicle on any public street, alley, or city-owned off-street parking area during the time the snow or ice begins to accumulate

through the duration of the snow/ice storm unless the snow/ice has been removed or plowed from said area and the snow/ice has ceased to fall.

The ban shall be enforced whenever the parking of a vehicle interferes with the removal of snow or ice. If the owner in violation of this ban fails to promptly remove the vehicle, a citation will be written, and a towing service will be contacted at the owner’s expense.

3-3-35 PARKING FOR CERTAIN PURPOSES PROHIBITED
No person shall park a vehicle upon the roadway for the principal purpose of:

1. *Displaying vehicle for sale*
2. *Displaying advertising*
3. *Selling merchandise from vehicle except in an established market place or when authorized under the Ordinances of this City*
4. *Storage as junk or dead storage for more than 48 hours.*
